



Company Profile

“Badagoni” wine company was founded in 2006 in the very heart of Georgian wine-making, Kakheti region, village of Zemo Khodasheni and today owns the most advanced wine factory in the Eastern Europe. The company philosophy stands for respecting the unique Georgian traditions and at the same time using the most advanced technologies and scientific knowledge existing in the modern wine industry to create the best Georgian wine.

Badagoni owns vineyards (400ha in total) in each micro-zone of Kakheti region and makes wine exclusively from the Georgian grape varieties. We are proud of the fact, that Badagoni major enologist is Dr. Donato Lanati, who is listed among the top five enologists of the world and is owner of the highest international award of winemaking – “Oscar del Vino.”

Badagoni winery is equipped with the modern and unique microfiltration and bottling lines, created by leading Italian companies “Bertolaso” and “Enotec” exclusively for Badagoni. Among the wine factory facilities there is also high-tech laboratory, where all the products are tested and analyzed, however final inspection of every product of Badagoni is made at the laboratory of the leading International Research Centre “Enosis Meraviglia” (Italy).

Wide range of Badagoni products comprise still wine, sparkling wine and Chacha.

During last 10 years Badagoni’s wines were awarded with the numerous international and local awards, certificates, medals and the trophies of “the Best Georgian Wine”. By the end of 2016 Badagoni qvevri wine (made by Georgian traditional method of wine-making) “Alaverdi Tradition” was awarded with the golden medal and the trophy of “Best Indigenous wine” at the Cathay Pacific Hong Kong International wine and spirit competition. This was a 1st precedent in the history of Georgian qvevri wine. This outstanding wine is made in the Alaverdi monastery wine cellar built in 9th century and restored with the support of Badagoni’s in 2006.

Badagoni is the place where unique Georgian traditions and the modern world meet each other and merge harmoniously and as a result makes it possible to produce great Georgian wine.
